**I. Administrative**

**A. Approval of the Technical Committee Meeting Agenda**

With no corrections nor additions, Steve Core motioned to approve the agenda and was seconded by John Limbocker; a unanimous vote was reached.

**B. Approval of the February 15, 2024 Technical Committee Meeting Minutes**

Mayor Hugh Hardgrave motioned to approve the minutes. John Limbocker seconded the motion. A unanimous vote was reached.

**C. MPO Director's Report**

Reese M. Brewer reviewed the MPO activities which occurred since the February 15, 2024 meeting. Activities related to the following topics were covered:

- **WAIA & Five Rivers Distribution MARAD Grant:** Reese provided a presentation at the Van Buren Chamber of Commerce on the status of the project. The environmental RFQ was let and a consultant selected.
- **Save AR Lives, Collaboration with the City of Fort Smith:** As a result of the Smart Growth America's Dangerous By Design coursework, Reese developed a concept for reducing traffic fatalities and begin to educate the public to help meet safety targets. This concept is called Save AR Lives. The City of Fort Smith offered to assist in the implementation and development of this campaign. We look forward to working with the City of Fort Smith on this effort.
- **Frontier MPO Electric Vehicle Infrastructure Federal Funding Opportunities:** Frontier MPO in coordination with the USDOT's ROUTES ([Rural Opportunities to Use Transportation for Economic Success](#)) program, held an online work session on the funding opportunities and toolkit "Charging Forward," available with the ROUTES program for Electric Vehicle Infrastructure and Charging.
- **Grants:** Frontier MPO was selected for the USDOT Thriving Communities program to study transit incentives and vouchers, along with a rural transit network and system on behalf of the Fort Smith Health Council Transportation Subcommittee. Frontier MPO submitted a RAISE grant application requesting \$400K on behalf of WAIA for a Railroad Laydown Yard design and plan.
- **Freight Roundtable 2025:** Reese is continuing to seek speakers, panels, and firms to present at the WAIA 2025 Freight Roundtable. Speakers and panelists include: Desiree Wood, Real Women in Trucking, Dr. Sarah Hernandez, UA Freight Lab, Kathy Fulton, American Logistics Aid Network (Disaster Response exercise), Erica Brigance, ArcBest, Data Science, ArcBest NVIDIA (Artificial Intelligence), from Advancing Sustainability through Powered Infrastructure for Roadway Electrification (ASPIRE), Dr. Regan A. Zane, Ivonne Santiago, Don Linford, and Michael Masquelier, and Fort Smith Chief of Police Danny Baker.
- **EV Charging Grants:** Assisting Van Buren with a state grant application.
- **GHG Emission Targets:** No Greenhouse Gas Emission Targets are due at this time. Twenty-two States filed two lawsuits challenging FHWA's greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions Final Rule. Pursuant to negotiations in these cases, FHWA agreed to temporarily not seek to enforce the February 1, 2024, deadline for States to submit initial

targets and reports through March 29, 2024. On March 27, the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Texas vacated and remanded the Final Rule to DOT, in effect nullifying the rule Nationwide. Consistent with the Court's decision, States and MPOs are not required to submit initial targets and reports at this time.

- **The next meeting will be held on August 22, 2024 - in coordination with the Fort Smith Health Council Subcommittee on Mobility. Special guest virtual speaker, Dr. Marina Serper will discuss Transportation Barriers to Healthcare.**

**D. Open Discussion/Public Comment Period**

Reese M. Brewer welcomed Ms. Tracee McKenna from WAPDD to provide an update on the Lavaca TAP grant and project. Reese encouraged all to provide details on any concerns, upcoming community events and notices. Michael Mings encouraged ArDOT to consider bike and pedestrian facilities during the improvements of Highway 45 in Fort Smith.

**II. New Business**

**A. Resolution 24-03 UPWP Approval:** Mr. Steve Core moved to approve; Mr. Sonny Bell seconded. A unanimous vote was reached.

**B. Arkansas Department of Transportation Update**

Marcus Rainwater of District IV ArDOT gave an update of various ArDOT Projects throughout the FMPO planning area. No action was taken.

**C. Oklahoma Department of Transportation Update**

Devon Westbrook provided a brief update on the statewide long-range transportation plan effort.
